## AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for the use of epinephrine auto-injectors by certain entities and organizations; and conferring powers and imposing duties on the Department of Health.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as Epinephrine Auto-
8	Injector Entity Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Administer." The direct application of an epinephrine auto-
14	injector to the body of an individual.
15	"Authorized entity." Any entity or organization, other than
16	a school entity described under section 1414.2 of the act of
17	March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code

of 1949, at which allergens capable of causing anaphylaxis may
 be present, including, but not limited to:

3 (1) recreation camps;

4 (2) colleges and universities;

5 (3) day-care facilities;

6 (4) youth sports leagues;

7 (5) amusement parks;

8 (6) restaurants;

9 (7) places of employment; and

10 (8) sports arenas.

"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
"Epinephrine auto-injector." A single-use device used for
the automatic injection of a premeasured dose of epinephrine
the into the human body.

Health care practitioner." An individual who is authorized to practice some component of the healing arts by a license, permit, certificate or registration issued by a Commonwealth licensing agency or board.

19 Section 3. Epinephrine auto-injectors for authorized entities. 20 (a) Prescribing and dispensing. -- Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a health care practitioner may 21 22 prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors in the name of an 23 authorized entity for use in accordance with this section. 24 Pharmacists and health care practitioners may dispense 25 epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant to a prescription issued in 26 the name of an authorized entity.

27 (b) Supply.--

(1) An authorized entity may acquire and stock a supply
of epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant to a prescription
issued in accordance with this section. The epinephrine auto-

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injectors shall be stored:

2 (i) in a location readily accessible in an 3 emergency; and

(ii) in accordance with:

5 (A) the epinephrine auto-injector's instructions 6 for use; and

7 (B) any additional requirements that may be
8 established by the department.

9 (2) An authorized entity shall designate employees or 10 agents who have completed the training required under 11 subsection (d) to be responsible for the storage, 12 maintenance, control and general oversight of epinephrine 13 auto-injectors acquired by the authorized entity.

14 (c) Use.--An employee or agent of an authorized entity or 15 other individual associated with the entity who has completed 16 the training required under subsection (d) may use epinephrine 17 auto-injectors prescribed under subsection (a) to do any of the 18 following:

19 Provide an epinephrine auto-injector to any (1)20 individual, or the parent, guardian or caregiver of the 21 individual, who the employee, agent or other individual 22 associated with the entity believes, in good faith, is 23 experiencing anaphylaxis for immediate administration, 24 regardless of whether the individual has a prescription for 25 an epinephrine auto-injector or has previously been diagnosed 26 with an allergy.

(2) Administer an epinephrine auto-injector to any
individual who the employee, agent or other individual
believes, in good faith, is experiencing anaphylaxis,
regardless of whether the individual has a prescription for

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an epinephrine auto-injector or has previously been diagnosed
 with an allergy.

3 (d) Training.--

An employee or agent of the authorized entity or 4 (1)5 other individual associated with the entity shall complete an 6 anaphylaxis training program as required by the department. 7 Such training shall be conducted by a nationally recognized 8 organization experienced in training laypersons in emergency 9 health treatment or an entity or individual approved by the 10 department. The department may approve specific entities or individuals or may approve classes of entities or individuals 11 12 to conduct the training. Training may be conducted online or 13 in person and, at a minimum, shall cover:

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(i) how to recognize signs and symptoms of severe allergic reactions, including anaphylaxis;

(ii) standards and procedures for the storage and
 administration of an epinephrine auto-injector; and

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(iii) emergency follow-up procedures.

19 (2) The entity that conducts the training shall issue a
20 certificate, on a form developed or approved by the
21 department, to each individual who successfully completes the
22 anaphylaxis training program.

23 (e) Good Samaritan protections.--

(1) The following shall not be liable for any injuries
or related damages that result from any act or omission taken
pursuant to this section:

(i) An authorized entity that possesses and makes
available epinephrine auto-injectors and its employees,
agents and other individuals associated with the entity;
(ii) a health care practitioner that prescribes or

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dispenses epinephrine auto-injectors to an authorized
 entity;

3 (iii) a pharmacist or health care practitioner that
4 dispenses epinephrine auto-injectors to an authorized
5 entity; and

6 (iv) an individual or entity that conducts the 7 training described under subsection (d).

8 (2) The immunity provided under paragraph (1) shall not 9 apply to acts or omissions constituting intentional 10 misconduct or gross negligence.

11 (3) The administration of an epinephrine auto-injector 12 in accordance with this section shall not be considered the 13 practice of medicine or any other profession that otherwise 14 requires licensure.

15 (4) This subsection shall not eliminate, limit or reduce 16 any other immunity or defense that may be available under 17 law, including that provided under 42 Pa.C.S. § 8332 18 (relating to emergency response provider and bystander good 19 Samaritan civil immunity).

20 (5) An entity located in this Commonwealth shall not be 21 liable for any injuries or related damages that result from 22 the provision or administration of an epinephrine auto-23 injector outside of this Commonwealth if the entity:

(i) would not have been liable for such injuries or
related damages had the provision or administration
occurred within this Commonwealth; or

(ii) is not liable for such injuries or related
damages under the law of the state in which such
provision or administration occurred.

30 Section 4. Effective date.

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1 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
